# 10 MARCH 2024 FOURTH SUNDAY IN LENT – Laetare or Mothering Sunday



Today's Gospel reading is taken from John's Gospel. It consists of two parts. The first part is the final sentence of Jesus' reply to Nicodemus, the Pharisee who approached Jesus at night. Nicodemus acknowledged Jesus as someone who had come from God and seemed to want to be a follower of Jesus. He misunderstood Jesus at every point, but there was no animosity in the questions Nicodemus posed to Jesus. Perhaps his misunderstanding fell away in time, for he was there at Jesus' crucifixion and was part of the group who buried Him.

The second part of today's Gospel is a theological reflection on Jesus' words to Nicodemus. In John's reflection, we find an observation about human sinfulness. Jesus is the light that has come into the world, but people preferred the darkness. We wish to keep our sins hidden, even from God. Jesus has come into the world to reveal our sins so that they may be forgiven. This is the Good News; it is the reason for our rejoicing in this season of Lent and throughout our lives.

MOTHERING SUNDAY AND MOTHER'S DAY Most people love their mothers and are grateful for what they have done for us. A day to say this with chocolates and flowers seems most appropriate. For Mothers gone from this world, a prayer of gratitude fits the bill. The Commercial World, ever anxious to exploit us, has dropped all reference to Christianity for fear of offending someone and turned this Mothering Sunday, their chance to flog us flowers, chocolates, meals out, cards, perfume and the like. There's no doubt that Mum deserves all this, but for us the commercial exploitation is not part of Mothering Sunday. The whole notion is bigger than just biological maternity. Mother Church is a theological truth, related to our lady at the foot of the Cross. Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows or to the Seven Sorrows is traditional on this Sunday. There is also a custom of visiting or remembering the

church where we ourselves were baptised into the family of Jesus Christ.
