21st April 2024 Easter IV – Good Shepherd or Vocations Sunday



As so often with St. John's Gospel, Chapter 10, the Shepherd Chapter, reminds us of the Beloved Disciples desire to show us exactly Who and What Jesus Christ is. We call this Christology. As the sheep are known by the Good Shepherd, the Father knows Jesus and Jesus knows the Father. There is an essential unity between the Father and the Son, and this is leading us towards the full revelation of the Holy and Undivided Trinity.

In the unity that He shares with His Father, Jesus roots His voluntary Passover Mystery. Throughout the Passion, His great act of shepherding love, Jeus is joined to the Father, and we catch a glimpse of His desire to unite us to the Father as well. Jesus also refers to others with whom He shares a relationship. By this reference, John probably understands the eventual inclusion of the Gentiles in the Christian community. Our modern ears hear this as a reference to Christian unity. The work of ecumenism is to restore unity among all Christians so that we form one flock under Jesus Christ the One Shepherd, as God desires.


SUNDAY MASS PROPERS

HALL REBURBISHMENT UPDATE Our plans to refurbish the parish hall have been continuing quietly but efficiently. You will recall the photo article in the Gazette. Before you see any scaffolding and works can even begin, we have had to lay out money on the necessary legal documents and requirements. We have had a bat survey done, [same bat time, same bat channel!] We have sought and been granted planning permission. Architect's drawings are required to obtain costings and estimates, before we can apply for grants or start the necessary fund raising. Our aim is to be environmentally friendly in all we do, as the Holy Father has so strongly suggested. Our hall is not just a parish resource but also a community hall, for many and various outside groups, from children's birthday parties to Karate. We want the hall to be warmer and this will require replacement windows as well as the major work on the roof. It is large undertaking but it we are confident in a continuing future and in offering a valuable service to those around us. Please remember this work in your prayers and in your giving. Major fund raising will begin as soon as we have more costings.

FR. PHILIP WRITES We are inclined to downgrade the image of the Good Shepherd, by making the sheep into sweet lambs, fluffy and squeaky clean. No effort or care is needed and there is enough saccharine in the scene to sink a battleship. It is not true to life. In the Cotswolds, we are aware that the



fortune of the area depended on Medieval sheep and the woollen industry. Great churches like, Fairford, Cirencester, South Cerney and Chipping Campden are known as the Wool Churches because they were built with the wealth of the local farmers and wool merchants. Fluffy lambs and glorious churches make us forget the very hard work of the shepherds living out in the fields, keeping watch over their flocks by night. Sheep rustling was rife. Though the cold and wet got in the bones, whilst the hands remained soft and supple with the lanolin from the wool, the smell never went away, even when it rained. Shepherds were frequently unable

to get to Mass in the Middle Ages and many thought they were a bad lot. Traditionally, they were buried with a ball of raw wool bunched up in one hand, so that God would know why He hadn't seen them often in church. Pope Francis has reminded the Church's shepherds to smell of the flocks they tend. Whether it is Chanel Number 5 or engine oil, they work hard for the good of others. Pray for your deacons and priests. Pray for our new Bishop, that, together, their work of care and concern may bring us the love of the Stricken and Risen Shepherd, Christ the Lord.
