




EASTER GREETING TO OUR LADY, BEFORE THE LAST HYMN AT SUNDAY MASS

'BEHOLD, I MAKE ALL THINGS NEW' This verse from the Apocalypse, the Revelation of St John, fits so well for the First Sunday of Eastertide. The much-misquoted Anglican bishop of Durham, Dr. David Jenkins, was alleged to have said dismissively that the Resurrection of the Saviour was merely a conjuring trick with bones. He did not actually say that. If he had, not only would he be a formal heretic, but he would be referring to those folk inside and outside Christianity, who think of the Resurrection as being very like the wonders of resuscitation we witness in hospitals up and down the land. The mistake is that they see it as this life restored. That was the Raising of Lazarus. It foreshadowed the Mystery of Easter, but it wasn't it!!!

Resurrection is not the old life restored. Christ truly died and was buried, lying inanimate in the grave, wrapped in the Holy Shroud. He moved forward to new life. He did not move backwards. We need something bigger and better and longer lasting than what this earthly existence affords. Christ makes things new. He changes lives, hearts, souls, minds, (bodies too)! Death is not the end, with Christ, it is the gateway to glory.
